MANAMA: Bahrain's new cabinet was sworn in last night before His Majesty the King, who urged ministers to help drive the country further forward.

"We assure you that you will find from our side all the support and backing to pave the way to achieving your objectives," he said as he chaired a special cabinet meeting, following the swearing in at Al Safriya Palace.

The King first received Prime Minister Shaikh Khalifa bin Salman Al Khalifa and

Then the Premier introduced the new, 23-member cabinet, before being the first to be sworn in and to take the oath, before the King.

Washington branded the vote pure theatre and said it would wait for the decision from Saddam, who has just three days under a UN Security Causail deadline to accept the Council deadline to accept the toughly worded resolution or

"The Iraqi parliament is

nothing but a rubber stamp for Saddam Hussein," said US President George W Bush.
